## **PLAY AREA PROJECT**

The Play Area Project at Cameley Playing Field is progressing!

The play equipment is now on order and due to arrive at a Hags warehouse in Selby on 17<sup>th</sup> July 2017. The Parish Council will be meeting the installation team for a Pre-Start Meeting at 6pm on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> July 2017 to agree final position of equipment and discuss the position of the works container and access to the site. Groundworks are expected to start on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> July 2017 and installation is expected to take 3-4 weeks in total.

The Parish Council will be planning an official launch event to celebrate the completion of this project and to bring the residents together to enjoy the new play area.

#### WAR MEMORIAL

The Parish Council will be arranging a coffee morning for September 2017 to engage and consult with residents on the war memorial to be installed on the Village Green.
